An Unknown Source for the Hussite Delegation to Lithuania in September 1421. A Contribution to the Origins of the Rule of Zikmund Korybutovič

The study presents and publishes a previously unknown source (three letters of credence and a diplomatic instruction preserved as contemporaneous German translation) regarding the Hussite delegation, which at the beginning of September 1421 received a mandate from the Diet of Kutná Hora and was sent with an offer of the Bohemian crown to Duke Vytautas of Lithuania. Interpretation of the source brings about new insights into the diplomacy of Hussite Bohemia from 1420 to 1421 in the context of the dispute between the individual estates and political factions concerning the candidate for the throne of Bohemia. The fragile compromise reached, evident in the content of the diplomatic instruction, did not last long due to the capture of the envoys in Racibórz.

The Library of the Chorynský Family from Veselí nad Moravou and the Phenomenon of “Aristocratic French” in 18th Century Moravia

The present study addresses the issue of the use of French by the Moravian nobility in the 18th century based on an analysis of the book holdings of the former château library at Veselí nad Moravou, belonging to the Chorynský family from Ledská. The first part of the study presents the Chorynský family and their elite position in 18th century Moravian society. During this period, the library in Veselí also grew, including 750 books in French. An analysis of this holding, mapped out using a printed catalogue from 1793, is the content of the main part of the study. Together with other sources, the library demonstrates the importance of French as the “elevated” language of the nobility, also used in personal communication between family members.

Elections in Moravia, the German Parties and Antisemitism 1905–1914

The German ‘freiheitliche’ (anti-clerical middle class) parties generally cooperated after the introduction of universal suffrage. Antisemitism, however, still was a major bone of contention between the old-style Liberal Progressives and the German Radicals, ex-followers of Pan-German guru Georg von Schönerer. In Moravia, Progressives still dominated the representation of Germans in both the Diet and the Imperial Parliament. Many of the German urban constituencies included sizeable minorities of Jewish voters. This was why in 1912 Moravian German Radicals themselves openly rejected the hard-line antisemitism of their Viennese leadership, praised the beneficial influence of the Rothschilds and welcomed Jewish allies.

Many such cases occurred in public houses, and the author deals with the role of social democrats and Protestants in these.

The “Militarization” of Royal and Imperial Justice during the First World War Using the Example of Central Moravia

The present study addresses the topic of wartime changes in the justice system in the Cisleithanian part of the Habsburg monarchy between 1914 and 1918, with emphasis put on the consequences these processes had for the civilian population. The case study method, or analytical probe, is used, with the town of Olomouc/Olmütz in central Moravia used as a laboratory where these changes can be followed. Both institutional changes and the militarization of the justice system, as well as their effects on court practice in specific cases, are analysed, with the ultimate goal being to show how the attitudes and loyalties of the general population were affected across the five years of the war.
